Reading — John 12:20-33 (NIV)

Jesus Predicts His Death

²⁰ Now there were some Greeks among those who went up to worship at the festival. ²¹ They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, with a request. "Sir," they said, "we would like to see Jesus." ²² Philip went to tell Andrew; Andrew and Philip in turn told Jesus.

²³ Jesus replied, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴ Very truly I tell you, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds. ²⁵ Anyone who loves their life will lose it, while anyone who hates their life in this world will keep

it for eternal life. ²⁶ Whoever serves me must follow me; and where I am, my servant also will be. My Father will honour the one who serves me.

²⁷ "Now my soul is troubled, and what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it was for this very reason I came to this hour. ²⁸ Father, glorify your name!"

Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and will glorify it again." ²⁹ The crowd that was there and heard it said it had thundered; others said an angel had spoken to him.

³⁰ Jesus said, "This voice was for your benefit, not mine. ³¹ Now is the time for judgment on this world; now the prince of this world will be driven out. ³² And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." ³³ He said this to show the kind of death he was going to die.

The Apostles' Creed

We pray for all who are enemies of the cross of Christ: that they may be transformed and have their hearts and minds raised to heaven and submit to the power of God. Lord, in your mercy. **Hear our prayer.**

We pray for those who are experiencing failure, disappointment or rejection: that they may set their hearts on the perfection that comes through faith in Christ.

Lord, in your mercy. Hear our prayer.

We pray for our own community of faith created in Jesus Christ: that we may find the fullness of life that God intends for us. Lord, in your mercy. **Hear our prayer.**

Father, listen to the prayers of your people, which we have made in humility and love and in the name of your Son, Jesus Christ, who died on the cross and rose again, and who is Lord for ever and ever. **Amen.**

We conclude our prayers by praying with confidence to the Father, as Jesus taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
