1 The Introduction

The sacrifice of God is a broken spirit: a broken and contrite heart you will not despise.

Ps 51:17

From God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ, who calls us to conversion of heart: grace and peace be with you.

All: And also with you.

Brothers and sisters in Christ...

I invite you, therefore, to the observance of a holy Lent through penitence and prayer, sacrifice and self-denial, fasting and charity, and by reading and meditating on God's holy word that we may come to celebrate with joy the paschal mysteries through which we are saved.

2 The Collect and Readings

The Ash Wednesday Collect is said

John 8:1-11

Listen to the gospel according to John.

Glory to You O Lord.

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives.

² At dawn he appeared again in the temple courts, where all the people gathered round him, and he sat down to teach them. ³ The teachers of the law and the Pharisees brought in a woman caught in adultery. They made her stand before the group ⁴ and said to Jesus, 'Teacher, this woman was caught in the act of adultery. ⁵ In the Law Moses commanded us to stone such women.

Now what do you say?' ⁶ They were using this question as a trap, in order to have a basis for accusing him.

But Jesus bent down and started to write on the ground with his finger. ⁷When they kept on questioning him, he straightened up and said to them, 'Let any one of you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her.' ⁸Again he stooped down and wrote on the ground.

⁹ At this, those who heard began to go away one at a time, the older ones first, until only Jesus was left, with the woman still standing there. ¹⁰ Jesus straightened up and asked her, 'Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?'

¹¹ 'No one, sir,' she said.

'Then neither do I condemn you,' Jesus declared. 'Go now and leave your life of sin.'

This is the gospel of the Lord.

3 The Self-Examination and Confession

Let us now call to mind our sin and the infinite mercy of God.

God the Father,
have mercy on us.
God the Son,
have mercy on us.
God the Holy Spirit,
have mercy on us.
Holy, blessed, and glorious Trinity,
have mercy on us.

From all evil and harmful actions; from pride, vanity, and hypocrisy; from envy, hatred, and malice; and from all evil intent,

Good Lord, deliver us.

From sloth, worldliness, and love of money;

from hardness of heart and contempt for your word and your laws, **Good Lord, deliver us.**

From sins of body and mind; From the deceits of the world, the flesh, and the devil, Good Lord, deliver us.

From famine and disaster; from violence and murder, and from dying unprepared, **Good Lord, deliver us.**

In all times of sorrow; in all times of joy; in the hour of death, and at the day of judgement, **Good Lord, deliver us.**

By the mystery of your holy incarnation; by your birth, childhood, and obedience; by your baptism, fasting, and temptation, **Good Lord, deliver us.**

By your ministry in word and work; by your mighty acts of power; and by your preaching of the kingdom, **Good Lord, deliver us.**

By your agony and trial; by your cross and passion; and by your precious death and burial, **Good Lord, deliver us.**

By your mighty resurrection; by your glorious ascension; and by the coming of the Holy Spirit, **Good Lord, deliver us.**

Give us true repentance; forgive us our sins of negligence and ignorance

and our deliberate sins; and grant us the grace of your Holy Spirit to amend our lives according to your holy word. Holy God, holy and strong, holy and immortal, have mercy upon us.

Silence is kept.

Make our hearts clean, O God; and renew a right spirit within us.

Heavenly Father,
we have sinned in thought, word and deed,
and have failed to do what we ought to have done.
We are sorry and truly repent.
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ who died for us,
forgive us all that is past and lead us in his way
to walk as children of light. Amen.

4 The Imposition of Ashes

As a sign of the spirit of penitence with which we shall keep this season of preparation for Easter, Gareth and I now mark on our heads in ash the sign of the cross, the symbol of our salvation.

The Imposition of Ashes by signing of the cross

The congregation at home are invited to sign their own foreheads with the sign of the cross, and we then pray together:

God our Father,
The strength of all who put their trust in you,
We remember that we are but dust,
and to dust we shall return.
We choose now to turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ.

Mercifully accept our prayers; and because, in our weakness, we can do nothing good without you, grant us the help of your grace, that in keeping your commandments we may please you, both in will and deed; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Sovereign Lord,
all our beginnings and endings are encompassed by you.
Help us follow in the footsteps of Christ
and seek your Kingdom with all our hearts.
In Jesus, may we find firm footing for our feet
and clear direction to our travels.
With his life and love breathed into our witness,
may we stand with him,
who, for the joy that was set before him,
endured the cross. Amen.

5 Holy and Spiritual Communion

We celebrate together the gifts and grace of God.

We take this bread,
we take this wine
to follow Christ's example and obey his command.

The Lord is here. **His Spirit is with us.**

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is always right...

Together we remember that Jesus is always with us and say:

Christ has died.
Christ is risen.
Christ will come in glory.

Father, as we remember...
All honour and glory belong to you, Father, through Jesus, your Son, with the Holy Spirit: one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Silence

As our Saviour taught us, we boldly pray:

Our Father who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name,
thy kingdom come, thy will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory,
for ever and ever. Amen.

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body for we all share in one bread.

Every time we eat this bread and drink of this cup We proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Eternal God, comfort of the afflicted and healer of the broken, you have fed us at the table of life and hope: teach us the ways of gentleness and peace, that all the world may acknowledge the kingdom of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
